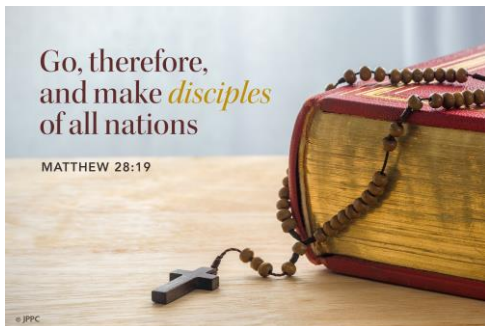

We are here today to celebrate the **Feast of the Trinity**. It is a celebration of our being loved enough to keep us asking, searching pondering, being warmed by anything which keeps us alive in faith, and interested in watching the play of God who delights amidst our human race. In the light of that spiritual disposition, we can give ourselves time to be renewed in our relationship with the three persons the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. And we can grow in our desires for a greater openness to the graces that each person wants to offer us. Eucharistic Adoration: Tuesdays, 1-5p.m., Chaplet prayed at 3p.m., Rosary at 4:30p.m. followed by Benediction. Thank you for your kindness in making sure there is always someone here in church during Adoration time.

On the first Saturday of every month, the **Blue Army** group follows the 8:15a.m. Mass with a rosary, meditation on the mysteries and confession until approximately 10:30a.m. Everyone is invited to stay after Mass to take part.

SAFETY TIP FOR PARISHIONERS

If you are approached either in church or out in the parking for money, please do not comply. We do not want to encourage this practice, and want to do our best to keep our parishioners and Mass attendees safe and free from solicitations. If this happens to you, please call the rectory to report it (we will ask where, what time, general description of the person) and we will take the steps necessary to hopefully discourage this from happening again.

An FYI, when trying to reach a priest in an **emergency situation** to administer the **Sacrament of the Sick** for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn’t immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.
