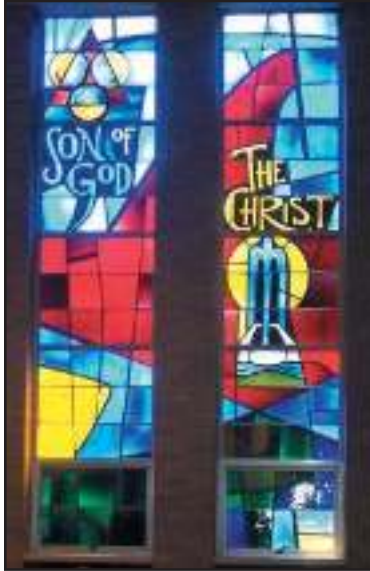

WORSHIP



From Your Pastor

Today we hear in the First Reading of the adventures of a shepherd and tree trimmer turned prophet. Amos has had some troubling visions, troublesome for the unjust and oppressive king Jeroboam who had conquered Israel. In previous chapters, Amos had given warnings against the rich and self-secure of Israel. What we hear in our Reading is Amaziah's dismissal of Amos from the king's temple, and he is telling Amos to go back where he came from and stick to his own business. Amos makes a very simple reply explaining his being called by God.

The Gospel is Mark's account of Jesus sending his disciples out to test their wings as missionaries. They are to take nothing upon which they can rely, but only their trust in Jesus' word. They were to take no food, nor money. They cured many, drove out demons and preached God's call to believe. Apparently, they did all right. It doesn't say they went hungry or were bereft.

We as Church and as individual missionaries leave the liturgy, leave our prayer, leave our comforting zones and live the Good News and that is our success. We try keeping on whether or not we see our victories. We continue to reach out, comfort, challenge and touch the needs of others and just sometimes, our offerings will be rejected and our extended hands not perceived well. Our fidelity is the revelation of God. The early disciples had to trust his word: we later disciples are doing the same. In the event you are not perceived well as God's instrument pray often for communities to make a turnaround knowing well enough it is God who chooses, it is God who anoints, and it is God who commissions.

Lo que oímos en nuestra lectura es que Amasías despidió a Amós del templo del rey y le dice que se vaya por donde ha venido y se dedique a sus asuntos. Amós responde de manera muy sencilla, explicando que Dios le había llamado.

El Evangelio es el relato de Marcos en el que Jesús envía a sus discípulos a probar sus alas como misioneros. No deben llevar nada con lo que puedan contar, sino sólo su confianza en la palabra de Jesús. No debían llevar comida ni dinero. Curaron a muchos, expulsaron demonios y predicaron la llamada de Dios a creer. Aparentemente, lo hicieron bien. No dice que pasaron hambre o que fueron despojados. Nosotros como Iglesia y como misioneros individuales dejamos la liturgia, dejamos nuestra oración, dejamos nuestras zonas de confort y vivimos la Buena Nueva y ese es nuestro éxito. Intentamos seguir adelante veamos o no nuestras victorias. Seguimos tendiendo la mano, consolando, desafiando y tocando las necesidades de los demás y sólo a veces, nuestras ofrendas serán rechazadas y nuestra extendida no será bien percibida. Nuestra fidelidad es la revelación de Dios. Los primeros discípulos tuvieron que confiar en su palabra: nosotros, los discípulos posteriores, hacemos lo mismo.
