



From Your Pastor

The readings which lead us to celebrate the Eucharist today, continue the display of God's urgent love to attract us and nourish us. The First Reading from Proverbs pictures Wisdom as setting somewhat of a Divine drive-in. She has set up her stand with wonderful things to eat and drink. A golden arch presents the invitation, Let whoever is simple turn in here. On the menu-board it reads, Eat my food and drink of the wine I have mixed. The Second Reading picks up this theme of living as wise humans. This Epistle urges us to the above -mentioned simplicity, which thirsts for truth and understanding rather than those things which assist in our avoiding the realities of living.

The Gospel continues the struggles between the faithful Jews and Jesus, who is presenting Himself as a continuation of God's love for them. We who listen to His words are called also to an openness of mind and spirit that allows His Wisdom to be our food and His Spirit to be our drink. We are invited to come and eat. He then sends us away to live that by which we have been fed and drunk.

Eucharistic Adoration: Tuesdays, 1-5p.m., Chaplet prayed at 3p.m., Rosary at 4:30p.m. followed by Benediction. Thank you for your kindness in making sure there is always someone here in church during Adoration time.

On the first Saturday of every month, the **Blue Army** group follows the 8:15a.m. Mass with a rosary, meditation on the mysteries and confession until approximately 10:30a.m. Everyone is invited to stay after Mass to take part.

<u>Next Weekend Holy Name Welcomes Fr. Oswaldo Garcia Sanchez</u> From The Augustinians of The Assumption

From the very beginning, the Augustinians of the Assumption (Assumptionists) have been engaged in a wide variety of apostolic works. All that advances the coming of the Reign of God has always been deemed worthy of our apostolic energy.

It's a preference for poor, in response to the Gospel and to the Church calling us today to be on their side. For us too it's a consequence of our own vow to live as poor men. Some will dedicate themselves full-time to this work: with marginalized people of every kind, in hospitals and in prisons, "worker priests" or volunteers in different organizations ... But all of us try to live in union with the poor, because "the poor will always be with us", because the poor are too often neglected even within the Church. This is a bias that the Assumption encourages.

Our Province of North America is specifically responsible for the missions in East Africa (Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania), Mexico and the Philippines. We provide personnel and financial assistance that is indispensable in order to maintain our charitable works (schools and nurseries) and formation programs for both laity and clergy in these countries. Many of our apostolates in these countries specifically work to better the living conditions of the impoverished brothers and sisters we live with and minister to. In the Philippines, we sponsor education and aid programs for underprivileged villages both in the Manilla area and in other mission centers. Our parish in Orizaba, Veracruz Mexico ministers to an underserved indigenous community.

Attention Parishioners,

We received a letter from the Chancellor saying that effective immediately the <u>Mass offering is</u> <u>raised to \$15.00</u>. The raise in the customary Mass offering comes from the bishops of the ecclesiastical province, not from the Bishop of Springfield (canon 952). This applies to new requests and is not retroactive. He asked that we remind people that this is not a price or fee, and that they may offer more, less or even nothing for a requested Mass intention. The \$15.00 limit answers the question, "What is the customary offering?"
