



Joshua in the final two Chapters is having a farewell celebration. He recounts the experience God has been fighting Israelite enemies and now the land is their own. Joshua is asking them about their looking forward. Joshua as Moses' replacement declares that he and his folks choose the Lord. The people reply that they too know their history and they are sticking with the winner who has made them victorious themselves.

In the Gospel we have reached the great conclusion of the discussion about Jesus being the bread of life and being the one sent. Many leave on hearing this but some stay including Peter. So, Jesus puts the big question to them and Him. Do you also want to leave? As with Joshua, Peter professes that they have seen enough to TRUST WHAT THEY CAN NOT SEE WITH THE EYES OF THE FLESH. We in our times we believe with our conscience, JESUS is OUR SAVIOR.

<u>This Weekend We Welcome Fr. Oswaldo Garcia Sanchez</u> <u>From The Augustinians of The Assumption</u>

From the very beginning, the Augustinians of the Assumption (Assumptionists) have been engaged in a wide variety of apostolic works. All that advances the coming of the Reign of God has always been deemed worthy of our apostolic energy. It's a preference for poor, in response to the Gospel and to the Church calling us today to be on their side. For us too it's a consequence of our own vow to live as poor men. Some will dedicate themselves full-time to this work: with marginalized people of every kind, in hospitals and in prisons, "worker priests" or volunteers in different organizations ... But all of us try to live in union with the poor, because "the poor will always be with us", because the poor are too often neglected even within the Church. This is a bias that the Assumption encourages.

Our Province of North America is specifically responsible for the missions in East Africa (Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania), Mexico and the Philippines. We provide personnel and financial assistance that is indispensable in order to maintain our charitable works (schools and nurseries) and formation programs for both laity and clergy in these countries. Many of our apostolates in these countries specifically work to better the living conditions of the impoverished brothers and sisters we live with and minister to. In the Philippines, we sponsor education and aid programs for underprivileged villages both in the Manilla area and in other mission centers. Our parish in Orizaba, Veracruz Mexico ministers to an underserved indigenous community.

Attention Parishioners,

We received a letter from the Chancellor saying that effective immediately the <u>Mass offering is raised to</u> <u>\$15.00</u>. The raise in the customary Mass offering comes from the bishops of the ecclesiastical province, not from the Bishop of Springfield (canon 952). This applies to new requests and is not retroactive. He asked that we remind people that this is not a price or fee, and that they may offer more, less or even nothing for a requested Mass intention. The \$15.00 limit answers the question, "What is the customary offering?"
