



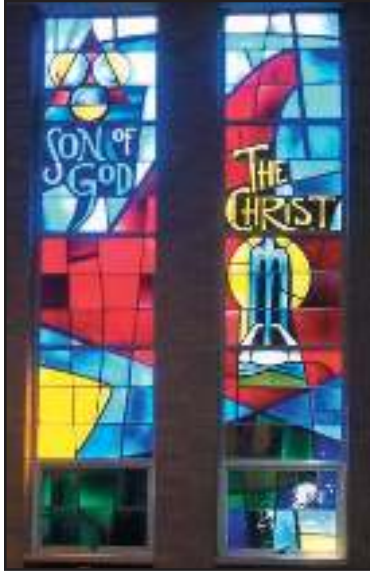

From Your Pastor

The First reading from Isaiah presents us how centered the Messiah will be. he will continue trusting the Lord even when he receives beatings and is disgraced. The Messiah is pictured as having heard and this allows Him to stay focused and not turn back.

We have in today's Gospel the high point of the big secret. Up to this point in Mark 's account, the disciples have marveled at Jesus's ability to calm storms, multiply bread, heal the sick and speak with authority, but they haven't been asked directly who they know Jesus to be. Once they would come right out and declare themselves, well that would center their focus and consequently, their lives.

Staying centered is our direction, God desires for us to be trusted in all areas of our lives. Hopefully we put to good use the gifts he gives us to do His will.

Eucharistic Adoration: Tuesdays, 1-5p.m., Chaplet prayed at 3p.m., Rosary at 4:30p.m. followed by Benediction. Thank you for your kindness in making sure there is always someone here in church during Adoration time.

On the first Saturday of every month, the **Blue Army** group follows the 8:15a.m. Mass with a rosary, meditation on the mysteries and confession until approximately 10:30a.m. Everyone is invited to stay after Mass to take part.

When trying to reach a priest in an **emergency situation** to administer the **Sacrament of the Sick** for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.

Collective Mass Intentions will be available at Holy Name

Collective intentions, also referred to as “multiple” intentions (at one Mass) are permitted per a notice received from the Diocese of Springfield, Office of the Chancellor. This means that we can accept more than one intention by one family at one Mass. These Masses cannot be celebrated more than twice each week, nor on a feast day. So, beginning with the first Sunday in November, which is November 3rd, we will be celebrating Masses with “Collective Intentions” at 10:30a.m. and at the 12:30p.m. Spanish Mass. Those are the Masses that seem to be the most requested, so it would make sense that those are the two where there will be multiple intentions permitted.

Basically, the only difference will be, if you call in to schedule a Mass Intention for Sunday at either 10:30 or 12:30, you will not hear “I am sorry, that Mass is already taken”, instead your intention will be accepted. (Note: we do want to keep the number of intentions to 10 or less.) If you need further clarification, please see a priest after Mass or call the rectory office during the week.

The raise in the customary **MASS INTENTION OFFERING** to \$15.00 comes from the bishops of the ecclesiastical province, not from the Bishop of Springfield (canon 952). This applies to new requests and is not retroactive. He asked that we remind people that this is not a price or fee, and that they may offer more, less or even nothing for a requested Mass intention. The \$15.00 limit answers the question, “What is the customary offering?”
