

WORSHIP



The very First Reading is taken from Prophet Daniel. In it we are presented with an account of some hard times for God's people. The time referenced is about five hundred years before Christ. Alexander the Great and other oppressors are ravaging the Middle East. Wars and distress are all around God's people. What we hear is the prophecy of God's taking care of them, but those who are in the Book. This is the "Book of Life" referred to often in Holy Scripture. It is a human attempt to describe or make understandable God's plan for human life. Regarding Todays Gospel, we are in the part of Mark's Gospel where we hear Jesus consoling His disciples about the trouble to come for them. Of course, this is really important for Mark's disciples- the first to read this Gospel - for the troubles they are facing. And it is really important for us as we face the troubles of our time. When Jesus said that no one knows when the end of time would be, He sure was right. For us today while we might be deeply concerned about the growing critical condition of our planet, the real issue of our concern is about the end of our lives. Who among us has not had a relative or friend pass on recently. I am equally affected by it for the young and old alike. We can face great difficulties including the sting of death itself, however with Christ's love, we will be firm for He is Our Loving Savior.

Eucharistic Adoration Time Change (The day will still be Tuesday)

With the daylight hours decreasing, the new time will be 1-4p.m. starting on November 5th. The Chaplet will still be prayed at 3p.m. and the Rosary at 3:30p.m. followed by Benediction.

On the first Saturday of every month, the **Blue Army** group follows the 8:15a.m. Mass with a rosary, meditation on the mysteries and confession until approximately 10:30a.m. Everyone is invited to stay after Mass to take part.

When trying to reach a priest in an <u>emergency situation</u> to administer the **Sacrament of the Sick** for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.

La primera lectura está tomada del profeta Daniel. En ella se nos presentan unos tiempos difíciles para el pueblo de Dios. La época a la que se hace referencia es unos quinientos años antes de Cristo. Alejandro Magno y otros opresores están asolando Oriente Medio. Las guerras y la angustia rodean al pueblo de Dios. Lo que oímos es la profecía de que Dios cuidará de ellos, pero de los que están en el Libro. Este es el «Libro de la Vida» al que se hace referencia a menudo en las Sagradas Escrituras. Es un intento humano de describir o hacer comprensible el plan de Dios para la vida humana. En cuanto al Evangelio de hoy, estamos en la parte del Evangelio de Marcos en la que oímos a Jesús consolar a sus discípulos sobre los problemas que les esperan.
