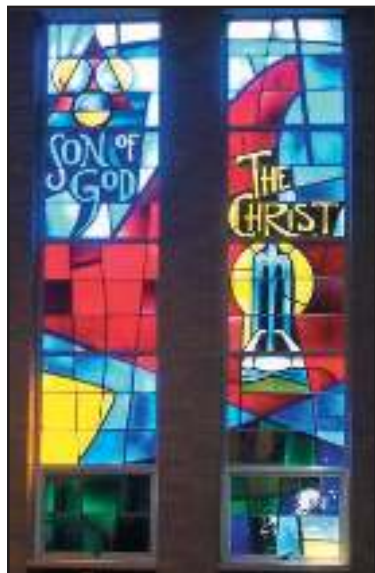

WORSHIP



From Your Pastor

WE ARE CELEBRATING THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME. THE READINGS THIS WEEKEND START OFF WITH PROPHET ISAIAH 62:1-5. IT CELEBRATES GOD'S DEEP LOVE FOR HIS PEOPLE. ISAIAH SPEAKS OF GOD'S PROMISE TO RESTORE JERUSALEM AND BRING JOY TO HIS PEOPLE, CALLING THEM A CROWN OF BEAUTY. THIS PASSAGE FITS A LARGER THEME IN ISAIAH ABOUT GOD RENEWING AND BLESSING HIS PEOPLE, EVEN AFTER TIMES OF HARDSHIP. THROUGHOUT THE BOOK, ISAIAH HIGHLIGHTS GOD'S COMMITMENT TO HIS PEOPLE, SHOWING THEM AS A DELIGHT TO GOD. THIS READING EMPHASIZES THE JOY AND CLOSENESS BETWEEN GOD AND HIS PEOPLE, COMPARING THEIR RELATIONSHIP TO THAT OF A BRIDE AND GROOM.

THE GOSPEL CONTENT COMES FROM JOHN 2:1-11. THE EVANGELIST JOHN TELLS OF JESUS TURNING WATER INTO WINE AT THE WEDDING AT CANA. THIS MIRACLE IS THE FIRST SIGN IN JOHN'S GOSPEL REVEALING JESUS' POWER AND SHOWING HIS COMPASSION. IT HIGHLIGHTS THEMES IN JOHN'S GOSPEL, SUCH AS JESUS BRINGING NEW LIFE AND ABUNDANCE, JESUS PERFORMS THIS SIGN QUIETLY, SHOWING THAT HE OFTEN WORKS IN HUMBLE WAYS. THROUGHOUT JOHN, JESUS MIRACLES INVITE PEOPLE TO BELIEVE IN HIM. THE WEDDING AT CANA POINTS TO THE JOY JESUS BRINGS AND HINTS AT THE GREATER WEDDING OF GOD AND HIS PEOPLE.

Mensaje Del Parroco, P. John Tibakunirwa.

Celebremos el Segundo Domingo del tiempo ordinario. Las lecturas de este fin de semana comienzan con el Profeta Isaías 62:1-5. Celebra el profundo amor a Dios por su pueblo. Isaías habla de la promesa de Dios de restaurar Jerusalén y en alegrar a su pueblo, llamandolo Corona de Belleza. Este pasaje encaja en un tema mas amplio de Isaías sobre la Renovación y la bendición de Dios a su pueblo, incluso despues de tiempos dificiles. A lo largo de todo el libro, Isaías destaca el compromiso de Dios con su pueblo, mostrandolo como un Deleite Para Dios". Esta lectura subraya la alegría y la cercanía entre Dios y su pueblo, comparando su relación con la de una novia o un novio. El contenido del evangelio pocede de Juan: 2.1-11. El Evangelista Juan relata como Jesús convirtió el agua en vino en las bodas de Caná. Este Milagro es el primer signo del evangelio de Juan, que revela el poder de Jesús y muestra su compasión. Destaca temas del evangelio de Juan, como que Jesús trae nueva vida y abundancoa> jesús realiza este signo silenciosamente, mostrando que a menudo obra de forma humilde. A lo largo de Juan, los Milagros de Jesús, invitan a la gente a creer en el. Las bodas de Caná apuntan a la alegría que trae Jesus e insinuan la gran boda de Dios y su pueblo.
