



Mother Church provides for us in the First Reading the second of two similar narratives about David's not killing King Saul. They are serious, but have a tinge of humor in them as well. In this Reading from Chapter Twenty -Six David had Saul "dead" to rights and showed great reverence by allowing Saul to live. In both stories David wanted Saul to know that he, David was not jealous, or trying to upstage his king, the "anointed of the Lord."

The Compassion or mercy or forgiveness is more than meets the ear here. The judicial system in our countries as within ourselves as well, may find various reasons to extend freedom to someone. That is not what is going on here. David is more than making a judicial decision. God has chosen Saul as King and so it is God that is reverenced through allowing Saul to go free and continue his being king

The content from the Gospel of Saint Luke 6:27-38 continues the Sermon on the Level. Luke's Four Beatitudes are fleshed out and made more particular in these verses. They center generally around the areas of how the follower of Jesus can reverse the natural tendencies towards greed, harshness of judgement, mercilessness and vengeance. These elements form quite an exact picture of our fallen - nature's way. The real challenge is for his hearers to be compassionate as God is compassionate with them. This the heart of the message. These instructions are a continuation of Luke's Beatitudes. the fact of the matter is they are invitations to try to live remembering that same divine compassion when we fail. God lends to us, blesses us, forgives us and always desires us to come to life and give that life as our way of revealing the goodness of God. What better way is there to live?

Eucharistic Adoration - 1-4p.m. on Tuesdays

The Chaplet will still be prayed at 3p.m. and the Rosary at 3:30p.m. followed by Benediction.

On the first Saturday of every month, the **Blue Army** group follows the 8:15a.m. Mass with a rosary, meditation on the mysteries and confession until approximately 10:00a.m. Everyone is invited to stay after Mass to take part.

When trying to reach a priest in an <u>emergency situation</u> to administer the **Sacrament of the Sick** for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.



Special Note: If you are asked to be a Godparent for a Baptism or a Confirmation sponsor, you will most likely be asked which church you regularly attend. If we are asked to verify it, we can only do so if you have registered with us.

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Mensaje Del Parroco, P. John Tibakunirwa.

La Madre Iglesia nos ofrece en la Primera Lectura la segunda de dos narraciones similares sobre el hecho de que David no matara al rey Saúl. Son serias, pero también tienen un toque de humor. En esta Lectura del Capítulo Veintiséis, David tenía a Saúl «muerto» por derecho y mostró una gran reverencia al permitir que Saúl viviera. En ambas historias David quería que Saúl supiera que él, David, no estaba celoso ni trataba de eclipsar a su rey, el «ungido del Señor».

La compasión o misericordia o perdón es más de lo que parece aquí. El sistema judicial de nuestros países, así como el nuestro, puede encontrar varias razones para conceder la libertad a alguien. Eso no es lo que ocurre aquí. David va más allá de una decisión judicial. Dios ha elegido a Saúl como rey y, por tanto, es a Dios a quien se reverencia permitiendo que Saúl quede libre y siga siendo rey. El contenido del Evangelio de San Lucas 6:27-38 continúa el Sermón del Nivel. Las cuatro bienaventuranzas de Lucas se desarrollan y concretan en estos versículos. En general, se centran en cómo el seguidor de Jesús puede invertir las tendencias naturales hacia la avaricia, la dureza de juicio, la falta de piedad y la venganza. Estos elementos forman una imagen bastante exacta de nuestra naturaleza caída. El verdadero reto es que sus oyentes sean compasivos como Dios es compasivo con ellos. Este es el corazón del mensaje. Estas instrucciones son una continuación de las Bienaventuranzas de Lucas. lo cierto es que son invitaciones a tratar de vivir recordando esa misma compasión divina cuando fracasamos. Dios nos presta, nos bendice, nos perdona y siempre desea que lleguemos a la vida y demos esa vida como nuestra forma de revelar la bondad de Dios. ¿Qué mejor manera hay de vivir?
