

## **From Your Pastor**

All of the Readings for this Second Sunday of Lent envision seeing God. The Old Testament makes clear that no person can see God and live. However, this is our desire--to see God and know Him as He knows us. In the Gospel passage for today the three disciples of Jesus, Peter, James and John are given such an invitation to see God's Glory as it shines through Jesus. It is the very essence and presence of God able to be seen vividly in its dazzling display. The Transfiguration of Jesus is a seeing through experience. Peter, James and John were privileged to have such an experience of seeing through to the reality of Jesus and His intimate relationship with God. Can I be attentive to those kinds of seeing through experiences in my life?

My prayer is I be open to them in every corner of my life and with God's grace, to see the depths of God's Glory as it shines towards me.

## **DIOCESE OF SPRINGFIELD 2025 LENTEN REGULATIONS**

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat as well as days of fast, when only one full meal is allowed. On days of fast two other meatless meals may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.
- 2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.
- 3. The obligation to abstain from meat begins at age fourteen (14) and does not cease.
- 4. The obligation to fast begins at age eighteen (18) and ends at age fifty-nine (59).

<u>Please note</u>: Although the faithful may excuse themselves from fast and abstinence, for a just cause, there is an obligation to substitute another penance in its place. No Catholic should lightly excuse him/herself from these Lenten obligations.

Saturdays from 3:30-4p.m. (except on Holy Saturday); on Holy Saturday (April 19<sup>th</sup>) they will be from 11a.m.-12noon only. Saturday (April 5<sup>th</sup>) for the First Saturday of the month at 9:30a.m., and by appointment.

Nota: Aunque los fieles pueden excusarse del ayuno y de la abstinencia, por justa causa, existe obligación de sustituirlo por otra penitencia. Nungún católico debe excusarse de la ligera de estas obligaciones cuaresmales.
